## Abstract:

This assignment will be used in LIB200. The theme of this course is Global and Local Displacements and the class spends two weeks discussing the construct of the "refugee crisis," U.S. refugee policy and the relationship to U.S. foreign policy.

This course is taken by Liberal Arts Majors at the advanced stage. It is the capstone course. The assignment will take students two weeks to complete and will be worth 15% of the grade.
